BYSS and 1 bis support local youths – October 2008.

Three local youngsters have benefited from financial assistance from the Lodge of Melrose St. John No. 12 and the Borders Youth Support Scheme (BYSS).

Amy Fraser from nearby Darnick is a promising young competitive swimmer who is among the highest achievers in her sport and already holds 4 Scottish records and has won, or has been placed, in many Scottish and GB competitions.

In addition to strength training several times a week, Amy trains in the swimming pool for 2 hours in the morning and 2 hours in the evening 6 days a week, her relentless hard work and self motivation has certainly paid off as the youngster is ranked No. 8 in Great Britain and is predicted to have a place at both the next Commonwealth Games and the London Olympics in 2012.

There appears to be few opportunities for sponsorship for competitive swimmers under the age of 16 even though it is in the younger age groups that swimmers start to develop their physique and dedication for continued achievement in the future. It is estimated that it can cost upwards of £3,800 to maintain and develop a swimmer of Amy's calibre.

Amy was awarded £150 from the Borders Youth Support Scheme and £100 from the Lodge of Melrose St. John No. 12 towards her swimming career and to help her achieve even better things in the future.
